## Major in Vocal Music Education Leading to a Bachelor of Arts Degree

This major prepares students to be recommended by the Washington and Lee Department of Education for Virginia licensure to teach vocal music in grades K-12. To be eligible to complete this major, the student must be admitted to the teacher education program. (See education pages for program information, requirements and course descriptions.)

The requirements for a major in vocal music education leading to a Bachelor of Arts degree are 43 credits in music (plus ensemble credits) and 27 credits in education:

Additional Requirements:

- In order to receive the endorsement of the music department, music education students must pass the piano proficiency exam prior to the semester preceding student teaching. Additional applied study in piano might be necessary and does not count toward the completion of the Applied Study credits.
- Participation in a University choral ensemble is required in each fall and winter term after declaring the music major; these courses do not count toward the total required music credits.
- It is highly recommended that foreign language study be in one of the three primary singing languages (French, Italian, or German). Students are also encouraged to take classes in all three of these languages.
- Concert attendance (as required by the department) as expected of every music major.
