From Oporto, Portugal, world famous for its production of port wine, we will explore the lovely wine country and enjoy a tasting.

Washington & Lee operated a highly successful voyage aboard the new expedition cruise ship, *Diana*, in the fall of 2023. We look forward to returning to this elegant, state-of-the-art vessel for our European voyage and invite you to experience its fine amenities, including spacious staterooms and suites, elegant lounges, expansive open decks, outstanding cuisine, and warm and personalized service.

We hope you will join Washington & Lee as we explore Western Europe's Historic Coastal Cities and Art Centers.

Built in Finland, and launched in April 2023, Swan Hellenic's *Diana* is a new generation expedition cruise ship. Although at 12,100 tons the ship is large enough to accommodate more than 350 passengers, *Diana* will accommodate a maximum of 192 guests in 96 spacious staterooms and balcony suites. The low guest density results in one of the most generous indoor and outdoor space-to-guest ratios among cruise ships.

Featuring the latest advances in technology and engineering, *Diana* is among the world's first environmentally responsible ships. Equipped with hybrid engines and a unique water filtration system, *Diana* leaves a minimal footprint. For cruising in Polar regions, the ship meets the stringent requirements of the new Polar Code with its high PC5 Category A ice strengthened hull and other advanced features. A computer-controlled Dynamic Positioning System allows the ship to maintain position without anchoring. Operated by a complement of 135 experienced European officers and international crew members, *Diana* will

carry a fleet of Zodiacs, versatile landing boats, and kayaks. Powerful stabilizers provide a smooth ride.

Diana's interior spaces exude sophisticated elegance, with most rooms opening to panoramic views of the sea. All staterooms and suites face outside and are equipped with private facilities, climate control, TV, Wi-Fi and USB connections and other amenities. Of the ship's 96 staterooms, 76 have balconies. Public areas include a spacious observation lounge equipped with state-of- the-art facilities for lectures and presentations; a club lounge; a restaurant that accommodates all guests at one seating; an outdoor café/bar that surrounds the heated swimming pool; a wellness area with gym, spa, and sauna with an adjoining outdoor jacuzzi; library; beauty salon; and an infirmary that is attended by a full-time doctor and nurse. The ship also features expansive open-deck areas. Two elevators connect all decks. Attentive service is provided on a 24-hour basis. The outstanding cuisine is complemented by fine wines at lunch and dinner.



Tuesday, July 30, 2024 **DEPART THE UNITED STATES**

Wednesday, July 31

AMSTERDAM, The Netherlands

Arrive in Amsterdam and transfer to the deluxe hotel *Hilton Amsterdam* (or similar). This evening gather with fellow travelers for a welcome dinner. (D)



Thursday, August 1

AMSTERDAM/EMBARKATION

Amsterdam is one of the great capitals of Europe, known for its picturesque canals and wealth of museums. After breakfast at the hotel, enjoy a tour of this marvelous city followed by a visit to the famed Rijksmuseum with its unrivaled collection of Dutch Masters. Late in the afternoon, transfer to the pier to embark *Diana* and set sail. (B, D)

Friday, August 2

ZEEBRUGGE/BRUGES, Belgium

Bruges is a perfectly preserved medieval town known for its charming canals, magnificent architecture, and exquisite art. A walking tour through narrow cobblestone streets takes us to the marketplace, Belfry Tower, Town Hall and the Chapel of the Holy Blood. Explore City Hall's main room, a masterpiece of Gothic design with late 19th-century murals and a polychrome vault. Also visit the Church of Our Lady, which houses Michelangelo's sculpture of Madonna with Child. (B,L,D)

Saturday, August 3

HONFLEUR/NORMANDY BEACHES, France

Honfleur sits on the banks of the estuary where the Seine River meets the English Channel. Its Old Harbor is extraordinarily picturesque and has been a favored subject of countless artists, including, perhaps most famously, Claude Monet. It is also our gateway to the beaches of Normandy and to Colleville-sur-Mer, home to the World War II Normandy American Cemetery and Memorial. The majority of the nearly 10,000 American soldiers killed at Omaha Beach are buried in this 170-acre cemetery on land given to the United States by France as a token of gratitude. (B,L,D)

Sunday, August 4

ST. MALO/MONT-ST.-MICHEL

This morning we arrive at the medieval city of St. Malo, a town that is fiercely proud of its seafaring traditions and was the lifelong home of the explorer, Jacques Cartier. It is also our gateway to the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Mont-St.-Michel. Rising abruptly from the flat Dol marshes is a great granite cone with a town, fortress and monastery clinging to its steep sides. Crowned by the 11th-century abbey church, Mont-St.-Michel is one of the architectural marvels of Western Europe. After lunch aboard ship, enjoy an afternoon tour of St. Malo, followed by time at leisure to walk along the town's walls and explore the little shops that line the quaint streets. (B,L,D)

Monday, August 5

TRESCO, ISLES OF SCILLY, England

Located about 30 miles off the coast of Cornwall, the Isles of Scilly are a cluster of low-lying islands that have been specially designated as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. Due to their mild winter climate and long hours of summer sunshine, they are able to host the botanical marvel that is Tresco Abbey Gardens. Benefitting from high walls and hedges that protect it from the Atlantic winds, this world-class garden prides itself on a collection of 20,000 plant species from



as far away as New Zealand, South America, and Southern Africa, all flourishing in latitudes that seem impossible. (B,L,D)

Tuesday, August 6

CONCARNEAU, France

Concarneau on the southern coast of Brittany is best known for its Ville Close (Walled City), built on a small island just offshore. This medieval fortification remains the heart of Concarneau, with 15th and 16th-century half-timbered, gabled buildings lining the cobblestoned streets within the walls. Rue Vauban, the main street, leads to the fishing port—the leading tuna port in Europe—where more than 200 boats line the docks in front of the fish market. (B,L,D)

Wednesday, August 7

AT SEA

During a day at sea, attend informative lectures and briefings from guest lecturers, relax and enjoy cruising the open sea, and treat yourself to some of the many amenities aboard *Diana*. (B,L,D)

Thursday, August 8

VIGO/SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA, Spain

Travel today to Santiago de Compostela, one of the most beautiful and historic medieval cities in Spain, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and the third most important Christian pilgrimage site in the world,

after Jerusalem and Rome. Our full day tour with lunch includes the Cathedral, the Townhall, and the Palace of Saint Jerome. Rejoin the ship in the port of Finisterre. (B,L,D)

Friday, August 9

OPORTO, Portugal

Oporto, Portugal's second largest city, is magnificently set at the mouth of the Douro River, its old quarters built on rocky tiers that cascade down to the river. This is certainly one of the country's most atmospheric and interesting cities. Explore the city in the morning on a tour that will include its most interesting landmark sites, including the *Ribeira*, the quayside that has been designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The area around Oporto is world famous for the production of port wine, and in the afternoon, we will visit one of the old wine lodges in nearby Vila Nova de Gaia to learn about this unique wine and enjoy a tasting as well. (B,L,D)

Saturday, August 10


LISBON/USA

Morning arrival in Lisbon. After breakfast, disembark and transfer to the airport for flights homeward. (B)


