Coveted by the ancient Greeks and Roman emperors, the Adriatic coastline of Croatia and Slovenia continues to entice modern explorers with its many riches—stunning natural beauty, significant history, and cultural jewels. Sun-dappled islands and well-preserved medieval towns dot the coast, each retaining its own authentic character and showcasing the idyllic marriage of land and sea.

We begin our tour in Slovenia's capital city, Ljubljana, and discover magical Lake Bled, monumental karst caves, and mountain aeries before continuing to Pula, Croatia to begin our 7-night Adriatic cruise. Launched in 2018, the beautiful 18-cabin *Queen Eleganza* yacht features a casual ambiance and the ability to call at small islands and ports not accessible to large cruise ships. Sail along the Croatian coast from Istria to Dubrovnik, calling at magical Zadar, Split, Hvar, and Korčula. Our leisurely pace allows ample time in port to sample regional cuisine and mingle with locals.

As our ship approaches, we'll see ancient walls rising from the water's edge, enclosing cobblestone streets and towns comprised of dramatic stone buildings with distinctive tiled roofs. In the distance, mountain peaks frame distinctive period architecture and archaeological treasures.





HIGHLIGHTS

- Explore Ljubljana, Slovenia's charming capital city, and ride gondola-like *pletnas* on the remarkably blue waters of Lake Bled.
- Marvel at the well-preserved Roman Forum in Zadar and the ruins of Emperor Diocletian's palace in Split.
- Investigate the UNESCO
 World Heritage site of Trogir,
 an island dating back to the
 Hellenistic period embellished
 by successive rulers with
 Romanesque, Renaissance,
 and Baroque architecture.
- Take guided walks at Plitvice National Park on wooden walkways and bridges through the magical landscape of cascading waterfalls, picturesque pools, and lush vegetation.
- Sample local delicacies and some of Croatia's most famous wines in Korčula.
- Delve into the historic sights of Dubrovnik,
 Pearl of the Adriatic.
- Moor at or near town centers aboard the super yacht Queen Eleganza, with easy walk-off access to explore independently.
- Swim in secluded coves in the pristine waters of the Adriatic Sea.











ITINERARY

SATURDAY-SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 14-15 LJUBLJANA, SLOVENIA

Depart the U.S. on an overnight flight to Ljubljana, Slovenia. Upon arrival, transfer to the centrally located Grand Hotel Union for an orientation, welcome reception, and dinner. GRAND HOTEL UNION (R,D)

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 16 **LJUBLJANA**

Following a morning lecture, take a walking tour of Ljubljana's historic Old Town, which is off limits to automobiles, and explore the cobblestone streets, bridges, and markets found in Slovenia's charming capital city. See the famous Dragon Bridge and stroll along the ancient Roman wall. After lunch, take the funicular to Ljubljana Castle or spend the afternoon at leisure. Once a medieval fortress, Ljubljana Castle was likely built in the 11th century and continues to serve as a historical and cultural landmark.

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 17 **LAKE BLED**

This afternoon visit picturesque Lake Bled and take gondola-like *pletna* boats to visit Slovenia's only island—a church-crowned islet in the center of the lake. Before returning to Ljubljana, tour an apiary—UNESCO has designated Slovenian

beekeeping an Intangible Cultural Heritage. Dine and explore Ljubljana independently this evening. GRAND HOTEL UNION (B,L)

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 18 ZADAR, CROATIA

Drive to Zadar by way of Plitvice Lakes National Park, Croatia's largest national park known for its beautiful lakes, caves, and waterfalls. Walk through lush forest scenery and marvel at the park's magnificent waterfalls and emerald lakes. Upon arrival in Zadar, embark *Queen Eleganza* for a welcome reception and dinner along the inviting waterfront.

QUEEN ELEGANZA (B,L,D)

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 19 TROGIR

Take a morning walking tour of Zadar, a city which boasts a rich history dating as far back to the Neolithic era. Here admire the ancient Roman Forum and the cylindrical-shaped Church of St. Donat. The streets of the old town are paved with shining white marble, and the inviting waterfront is a magnet for art lovers. In the afternoon, relax on the sun deck and have lunch on board while cruising to Trogir.

QUEEN ELEGANZA (B,L,D)

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 20 **SPLIT**

This morning tour Trogir, a UNESCO World Heritage site located on a tiny island,









surrounded by medieval walls. Enjoy lunch and, weather permitting, a swim in a quiet cove, en route to Split, Croatia's second-largest city, this afternoon. Upon arrival, take a walking tour of Roman Emperor Diocletian's Palace spread along the Split waterfront.

QUEEN ELEGANZA (B,L)

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 21 **HVAR**

Today cruise to lavender-scented Hvar Island, known as the "Queen of the Dalmatian islands." Stroll along the elegant main square and visit a Benedictine monastery to see lace made by nuns from aloe threads. Explore the yacht-filled waterfront and the restaurant-lined avenues at leisure this evening.

QUEEN ELEGANZA (B,L)

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 22 **KORČULA**

Cruise to the fortified town of Korčula, perched on a promontory on its namesake island. Korčula is rich in vineyards and olive groves, picturesque villages, and a glorious old town, as well as ageold religious ceremonies, folk music, and dance traditions. Following an insightful walking tour, sample local delicacies and some of Croatia's most famous wines, including white wine made from pošip grapes, grown primarily on the island. MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 23 MLJET

Today walk or e-bike amongst shady forests of Aleppo pine or kayak in a saltwater lake at Mljet National Park. This evening dock in Pomena, a small village on the west end of the Island of Mljet. QUEEN ELEGANZA (B,L)

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 24 **DUBROVNIK**

En route to Dubrovnik, attend the final lecture of the educational program. There may also be an opportunity to swim in the azure waters of the Adriatic Sea before docking at Dubrovnik. Noted for its expansive walls and red tile rooftops, Dubrovnik is perhaps the most-visited destination on the Adriatic coast. On a guided tour, explore the sites along the marble-clad Stradun, including Onofrio's Fountain, St. Blaise's Church, and the Franciscan Church and Monastery, a large complex belonging to the Order of the Friars Minor and consisting of a monastery, church, library, and pharmacy, the latter of which dates from A.D. 1317. Take advantage of free time in the afternoon to explore the maze of alleyways and Renaissance-era architecture before a farewell dinner on board.

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 25 **DUBROVNIK / HOME**

Disembark this morning by 9:00 a.m. and transfer to the airport for flights home. (B)














QUEEN ELEGANZA

The super yacht, Queen Eleganza, launched in the spring of 2018, was beautifully crafted in Croatia specifically to cruise the Adriatic coastline. With a maximum of just 34 guests, there is a relaxed and informal atmosphere on board. The 18 cabins are finished to high standards with sleek lines and neutral colors. The bar/restaurant and lounge boast comfortable seating areas, large windows, and complimentary tea/coffee. Meals are served in a single seating and feature fresh and tasty Mediterranean cuisine with beer and wine included.
