History, Politics, Economics, Sociology, and Anthropology courses are required for licensure. Religion courses that include historical content may apply as well. Please note a 4 in an equivalent AP course will count as having met any requirement below for licensure purposes.		
History: You must have at least 6 credits of US History or a 4 or 5 on the US History AP Exam. Suggested Courses: HIST 107 and 108		
9 credits of politics courses that have significant content on American History such as POL 203, 214, 234, 235, 236, 250, 255, 295, 350, 360, 370, 397		
6 Credits of World History; HIST 173, 174 or the equivalent REL 100 is also recommended. 6 Credits of Politics courses that include content on European or Asian countries, such as, POL 215, 227, 245, 246, 247, 272, 285, 288, 296, 327, 380, 392		
Politics: requirement met by the major:		
Economics: 6 credits -- requirement met by the major, ECON 101, and 102.		
Sociology or Anthropology: 3 credits; may be met by a Politics course that is cross-listed with Sociology or by – SOAN 101, 102, 223, 224, 225. 238, 251, 260		
FDR Science Requirement: GEOL 101 Recommended for the endorsement
